Climate Change Conference Focuses on Local Governments
LA Mayor Villaraigosa Opens Conference

WHAT: *Confronting Climate Change: A Focus on Local Government Impacts, Actions and Resources.* This conference will provide a summary of the most recent scientific understanding of climate change impacts to California cities and counties and review the State-based tools and resources for local governments to address climate change impacts. Discussions focus on coordinated local and regional efforts, funding opportunities, and strategies to reduce risk and impacts from a changing climate. This complementary conference builds on the "Governor's Conference on Extreme Climate Risks and California's Future" last December.

WHEN: Monday, April 9, 2012, 9 a.m. – 4:45 p.m.

WHERE: California Endowment, 1000 North Alameda Street, Los Angeles.

WHY: California leads the world in combating climate change by reducing greenhouse gas pollution, however the real and serious impacts of climate change require preparation and organization. The link between climate change and more frequent and severe weather events – larger storms, increased flooding, more and increasingly intense wildfires, longer droughts and sustained water shortages – is no longer in doubt. By working together, government, local communities, businesses and residents can decrease the negative impacts of natural disasters and extreme weather events. This conference will inform revisions to the California Adaptation Strategy to include local and regional planning efforts.

WHO: More than 200 attendees are participating in this one-day conference. Conference speakers are leading experts in climate change science, water policy, public health, and local and regional planning.
