Description: On July 22, 2002, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, under the authority of the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended, listed the Sonoma County Distinct Population Segment of the California tiger salamander as an endangered species under an emergency basis (Federal Register 67: 47726-47740). The factors imperiling this animal in Sonoma County, California, include habitat destruction, degradation and fragmentation, collection, invasive exotic species, and inadequate regulatory mechanisms.

We regret to inform you that the State Clearinghouse will no longer be able to honor requests for written confirmation of the posting of a Notice of Determination (NOD) or Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the Governor's Office of Planning and Research (OPR). In the past, and as a courtesy, we were able to comply with requests for written confirmation. However, due to recent budget cuts and an increasing volume of special requests, we can no longer provide such confirmation, either by mail or by fax.

Sections 15075 and 15094 of the CEQA Guidelines spell out the responsibility of the State Clearinghouse to post NODs. Section 15062 (c) of the Guidelines spells out the responsibility of the SCH to post NOEs. We realize the importance of timely posting because this begins a statute of limitations on court challenges. OPR will continue to post NODs and NOEs in a timely manner and enter the notice information in our online CEQAnet database.

If you fax a NOD or NOE to the State Clearinghouse, please retain the fax confirmation for your records. If you file a NOD or NOE with us in person, please provide a second copy of the document and we will at that time be happy to date stamp and return it to you immediately. If you mail a NOD or NOE to us, you may call the State Clearinghouse at (916) 445-0613 to request verbal confirmation of receipt, or obtain written confirmation of posting by printing a report from the CEQAnet database at www.ceqanet.ca.gov.

We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause and will continue to provide the best possible service to the public within our means.



Notice of Intent to Rescind Freeway Adoption Segment of State Route 135 in Santa Maria

WHAT IS BEING PLANNED?

The California Department of Transportation (CALTRANS), in cooperation with the City of Santa Maria and County of Santa Barbara has requested that the California Transportation Commission (CTC) remove the Freeway Route designation for a portion of State Route 135, in Santa Barbara County, from 0.6 kilometer (0.4 mile) north of Clark Avenue to 0.5 kilometer (0.3 mile) north of Santa Maria Way. This segment of the route would be re-designated as a conventional highway and would remain a state highway and all existing right-of-way would be retained for future transportation needs.



WHY THIS AD?

A request for Notice of Intention to Consider Rescinding Freeway Adoption (NIU 02-01), was reviewed and approved by the California Transportation Commission (CTC) on July 18, 2002. That approval allows CALTRANS to gather public input to be used in the final recommendation to the CTC. This notification provides 60 days for the public to comment on the proposed change from freeway designation to conventional highway designation before Caltrans returns to the CTC with their Final Recommendation on November 6-7, 2002.

WHAT'S AVAILABLE?

For the original presentation of rescission to the CTC, two documents were prepared and are available for viewing at the Caltrans District 5 Office located at 50 Higuera Street, San Luis Obispo, CA, 93401. These documents include a Route Inventory Report (RIR) for State Route 135 and the Notice of Intention of Consider Rescinding Freeway Adoption (NIU 02-01).

When are Comments due?
