The existing curve is a non-standard 35-mile per-hour turn within a 55-mile per-hour highway. The proposed project is 0.4 miles in length. The project would move the right-of-way line about 60 feet north and would acquire about 3.91 acres of additional right-of-way, allowing a section of the mountain slope to be excavated and increasing sight distance for both east and westbound drivers to maintain a speed of 45 miles-per-hour.
